

The Sunnah

One day during "the Farewell Pilgrimage" the prophet Muhammad stood up to address the people and one of the things he said to them was

"I am leaving two things among you, and if you cling to them firmly you will never go astray; one is the Book of Allah and the other is my Sunnah."

The Prophet (may Allah's peace be upon him) was sent with two things: The first as we have learnt is the Qur'an. The second is the Sunnah. The Qur'an is known as revelation. This is something sent down by Allah. The Sunnah is also revelation from Allah

A Hadith is a narration from the companion that is written down about the Prophet Muhammad; what he **said**, **did**, **commanded** or **forbid**, or **how he was**.
